The eleventh meeting of *Bridging the Community* was held on November 18, 1998 at 7pm at the Kennett YMCA with forty committed members attending. Lisa Lightner from the YMCA gave us a history of the YMCA organization as well as a history of the new building. New attendees were introduced.

Joan Holliday reviewed the Purpose statement for our shared Field of Endeavor. She reflected on the Chip and Dip Volunteer Fair put on by the youth on October 23, 1998 and how they managed the entire event through the same principles that *Bridging the Community* has been guided by this past year.

### Principles:

1. Start from a vision and purpose that is rooted in pursuing potential.
2. Fuel the purpose with our unique spirits and heart.
3. Do the right work and don't worry about who gets the credit.
4. Peacefully, progressively, include.
5. No added infrastructural burden.

The youth also reflected on the principles and spoke about the self and community fulfillment this way of working had for all of them.

The group was then broken into four subgroups led by Joan Holliday, Gerry Zippilli, Anita O'Connor and Marcia Malchione. Each group looked at ways that efforts and people could "bridge" and reinforce each other's efforts as well as plan for more joint efforts. The idea of sharing a common philosophy was the unifying thought that brought more coalescence to the group.

Reflections were shared after the subgroup about the experience of working in smaller groups:

1. Being in smaller groups helped us get to know each other better.
2. We found many ways we could reinforce and support each other's efforts.
3. We saw that this group is not about membership, but about people who care about creating a process whereby people across the community can come together to pursue the right and good things for the community.
4. We saw the journey was the most important thing.
5. We saw that we need to be thinking about who we need to invite in and make aware of our meetings to continue to progressively, include----

The twelfth meeting of *Bridging the Community* was held on January 13, 1999 at 7 pm at Unionville High School with thirty-two caring members. The meeting began with honoring Mayor Charles Cramer for his "gift from the heart" throughout his life in Kennett. A plaque was awarded, which reads: **Bridging the Community** honors Mayor Charles Cramer. In giving from your heart so fully, you have become a LIVING EXAMPLE for our COMMUNITY.

We will aim to live up to your high ideals of:

- Celebrating the uniqueness of ALL people
- Encouraging others to get involved in community
- Pitching in wherever there is a need.

WE WILL STRIVE TO CARRY ON YOUR LEGACY

The mayor encouraged us to continue doing our work and said his "heart will always be with us". Individuals from the community took turns expressing their appreciation for qualities expressed by the mayor in the many areas of involvement in the community.

New attendees were introduced, Carmen Lesesne (Miss Lincoln University), Sandy Marshall (Unionville Community Service), Heidi Bowman (WCU student teacher at Mary D Lang), Gerard and Melissa, (Unionville Serves), Samoan and Collie (Kennett Paper), and Laurie Malchione, Gabby, Corey, and Mika Medina (Study Buddies), and Ryan (Emily's friend), Debbie Rochester.

Superintendent, Chuck Garris gave us a history of the school building and said they have 1,100 students, expecting to grow to 1,300 soon.

Principles for our work:

3. Respect each other's process, but don't lose the higher order process.
4. Community is our smallest whole
5. No added infrastructural burden.

A flyer identifying the areas for volunteering with the youth was passed out. Participants from MYKE, STUDY BUDDIES, YMCA, AFTER THE BELL PROGRAM spoke about their experience of volunteering and invited community members to meet specific needs. Four Study Buddies children attended the meeting—We sang Happy Birthday to one.

We moved out of the large group and interacted with each other in smaller groups around ways to bridge.

Bridging ideas and ideas for other community efforts were shared in the large group:

- Unionville Serves will put on a Valentine Party for all the Study Buddies on Saturday, February 13, 1999.
- Someone has a large punching bag and gloves to donate to the YMCA
- A 16 yr. old boy will be linked with a Lincoln University student in a mentoring relationship.

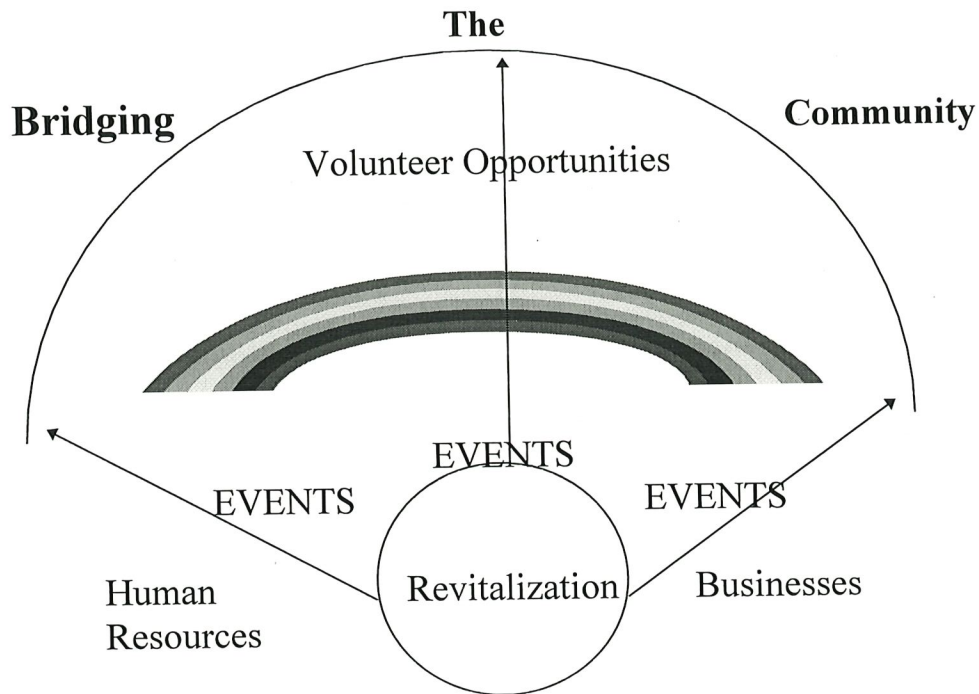
- Our community needs a place for the post high-school adults to hang out and have good clean fun.
- Lincoln University students will bridge with Study Buddies and also invite them to the University for a field trip.
- Someone offered to bring paper to the Study Buddies for work paper.
- Volunteers will be shared and After the Bell will encourage their contacts to get involved with MYKE.
- Bridging the Community was described as a “community without walls”—we are pure process and invite everyone in.
- Kennett Internet will place Bridging the Community on the Homepage and we can keep our community aware of volunteer opportunities. Anita O’Connor said she will ask the rotary if they will pay the monthly fee and Kennett High School Students will help design and set up the web page.
- We will meet every other month—the second Wednesday at 7pm. Meeting place will be decided at each meeting---location will be announced on the Internet and in the newspaper.

He described how they dug out the foundation by hand and that the major part of the church was built by members of the church. They have 4 services on Sunday.

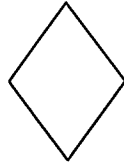

If children live in fairness,

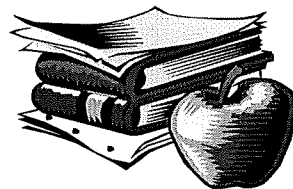

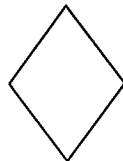

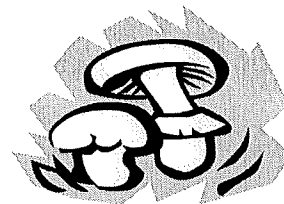

Michael Pia has bought Center Square Apartments to become a responsible landlord for the workers.

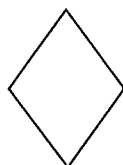

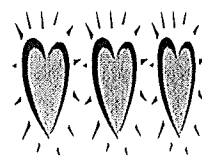

Our meeting began with an invocation by Anna Anderson, Leader of Christ Temple Study Buddies. Sue Calio and Alice Peters welcomed us and gave us a short history of the Bayard Taylor Library. The room we were meeting had a special collection of books written by Bayard Taylor himself.

New members attending our meeting were introduced. (See list at end of minutes). A new group, the MOM’s Club told us about themselves. They are a local chapter of a national organization. They are a club that provides an arena for social and volunteer opportunities for stay-at-home mothers.

New volunteer efforts were presented:

Avery Bass told us about the YMCA After School Daycare programs at Kennett’s three elementary schools and at UHS Middle School. Avery said that students receive help with their homework. Avery also talked about the opening of the new Teen Center. There are now weight lifting machines, computers and a ping pong table for teens. Starting in October, every Wednesday there will be a Health Educator from a local agency for students.

Loretta Perna and Joan Holliday introduced the high-school tutoring volunteer program they are starting at the YMCA starting in October. Loretta Perna spoke about the language barrier problems Latino high-school students experience and would like to sign up for more college-bound courses. Loretta will bring the Latino youth to the YMCA after school Monday and Thursday from 3pm to 6pm and Joan Holliday is recruiting tutors from Kennett and Unionville.

Sue Yocum, 2<sup>nd</sup> grad teacher at Mary D Lang told us about her new book that will be released. It is entitled—*A Day At A Pennsylvania Mushroom Farm*. They books will be sold in town. She also will be mentoring high-school student, Ryan McCloud in her classroom. Ryan is following the model Laura King followed last year. By the end of the year, Ryan will teach a full day in Mrs. Yocum's classroom.

Deborah Shutika and Assistant Principal, Ray Fernandez reported that the Teen Peer Mentoring process has begun in Kennett High School. It is starting small (about 10-15 pairs) and the hope is that this caring process will grow. Deborah also announced that there will be another conference sponsored by Project Salud and LaComunidad entitled: *Bridging the Community Around Teen Health*. The conference will be held at the Red Clay room one day TBA the week before Thanksgiving. A newsletter will be coming out soon.

Ryan McCloud and Emily Thomforde introduced the project that the youth will be holding on Make a Difference Day on Saturday, October 23, 1999. Their hope is to do some volunteer work for the Kennett businesses and include the middle school youth so that they learn about volunteering early in life. (This is to carry on the energy of the Chip & Dip Festival last year.) The details are to be announced. Emily and Ryan set up a Core Team meeting on September 16, 1999 at 7 pm at Kennett High School.

Unionville Serves President, Megan Akerson and Lindsay Smith would like to get involved particularly in the Study Buddies process in the four churches in town. They will encourage their organization to join all the other volunteer opportunities.

Chris Valesquez Cruz announced along with Ray Fernandez that the Latino Youth Leadership Conference will be held at Kennett High School in April 2000. Chris spoke about his enthusiasm and about getting many people involved. After the conference, the Latino students will form a Unidad group to continue the ongoing support for the Latino students.

Courtney Watson spoke about Upward Bound at Lincoln University. She, along with others from Kennett participated the several years. She spoke highly about how it educates the students in their subjects and it helps build confidence to go on to college. The program is for students who parents have not attended college and it is open to all races. During the intensive summer session, the students took courses that they will be taking again in at their perspective high schools in the fall.



Clarke Green told us that Boy Scout Troop 24 was very interested in recruiting a broader base candidates for the Cub Scout Program. They now have scholarships for low income. He encourages all of us to recruit.

Emily Thomforde presented information MiAe Kang gave her on the *What If Organization*. This organization expands the view of youth for what is possible through empowering them to invent a future based on vision and commitment, and to become fully responsible for the results they produce in their life. This organization is seeking one million signatures to support the *Possibility Generation Proclamation* which will be presented in October at a UN sponsored international youth congress on peace and sustainability. 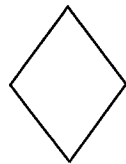

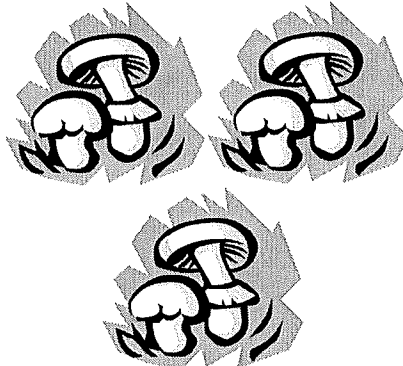
